MDFT Projects in Miami, Tampa,  
and New Orleans**

The **Center for Treatment Research on Adolescent Drug Abuse (CTRADA)** (see center website <http://www.miami.edu/ctrada>) at the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine is currently hiring therapists to work on projects in Miami, FL; Tampa, FL; and New Orleans, LA. We are recruiting masters-level therapists to work with clinically-referred, drug using and juvenile justice-involved adolescents and their families. MDFT uses a home-based treatment system but sessions also occur in the clinical and other community locales. Evening hours are required to see one's cases. Therapists receive extensive initial training and ongoing supervision in a research-proven treatment - Multidimensional Family Therapy (MDFT).

Full time positions are 40 hour positions. In the part time positions, which are devised according to the availability of successful applicants, therapists could carry as few as one or two cases. Both part time and full time therapist positions require participation in weekly individual and group supervision.

**Ideal Candidates:**

- 1) Background - Master's Degree in Family Therapy, Counseling Psychology, Mental Health, Social Work, or related field.
- 2) Have competence and experience in working with adolescents and families, and extra familial systems as part of treatment.
- 3) Have strong interpersonal and communication skills
