NIH/NIDA-funded postdoctoral research position available at the University of Miami Center for Treatment Research on Adolescent Drug Abuse. The CTRADA prepares post doctoral researchers for research and academic positions by developing clinical research competencies in the specialty of adolescent drug abuse intervention research. Our research center conducts a range of treatment outcome and process studies with adolescents. The postdoc becomes integrally involved in one or more of the Center's studies, which focus on adolescent drug treatment efficacy, therapy mechanisms and process, and treatment dissemination. This work incorporates a focus on special populations (e.g., females, comorbid youth, minority teens and families). The postdoc works with established investigators in developing new proposals, managing ongoing studies, conducting statistical analyses, and disseminating study results through presentations at national meetings and publications of the work, as well as developing their own research ideas. Clinical training and experience with manual-guided, evidence-based treatment is also possible. Applicants must hold a doctoral degree (family therapy / family psychology background preferred), have demonstrated research and writing skills and an interest in family-based treatment research with adolescents. Job Description – Post Doctoral Researcher

1. Participate in regular investigator meetings for discussion of ongoing studies and developments in adolescent drug abuse intervention science.
2. Prepare presentations of study results at national meetings.
3. Collaborate with CTRADA faculty to develop, execute and complete collaborative research studies.
4. Prepare and submit study results for publication.
5. Participate in clinical team seminars and treatment development workgroups to understand the family-based treatment being researched.
6. Assist in managing study protocols, supervising Research Associates, and overseeing day-to-day progress on research studies.
