## Global Appraisal of Individual Needs Web Application Features

### Client-driven

Client records are organized to allow the tracking of clients through multiple episodes of care.

### Interactive administration

Interviews may be conducted interactively with skips and calculations automated to reduce the administration time and ensure that full attention is given to the client.

### Validation checks

Inconsistencies are flagged so that interviewer may clear them up in realtime.

### Ease of navigation

An interviewer may easily navigate to specific sections and items throughout the instrument.

### HIPAA compliance

Security has been implemented at the highest level to comply with current HIPAA privacy and security rules.

### Aggregate data

Data may be exported to an ASCII file, which can be read in to statistical software for analysis and reporting.

### Share client records

A copy of a client records may be transferred or received within the GAIN ABS system.

### Updated GAIN Recommendation and Referral Summary (GRRS)

The GRRS generates DSM diagnostic impressions based on client self-report and provides clinicians with the option to easily select alternative DSM diagnoses. The GRRS also generates highly individualized treatment planning statements for each ASAM Dimension based upon the client's service utilization history and problem severity, with the option for the clinician to over-ride, modify, delete, or add to the recommendations.

### Maintenance and updates

Chestnut Health Systems' GAIN ABS Support team provides all maintenance and regularly incorporates updates and new functionality to the system.

**Presenting Concerns and Identifying Information**

Phillip is a 17-year-old White male who has never been married and has no children. He presented as typically groomed with no apparent physical abnormalities. He was referred to Chestnut Health Systems by Ryan K., his Probation Officer. Phillip stated that his reasons for coming to Chestnut Health Systems was because 1) he was arrested for cannabis, and 2) his P.O. had to come for eval. Phillip last attended school or training within the past two days at a Regional Alternative School and has completed through grade 10. Phillip reported last working 1 to 3 months ago at "X-All Construction". Phillip lives at home with his mother and twin brother. His parents are separated and share custody of him. Phillip has a history of being seen by Dr. Holly for ADHD, bipolar disorder, and depression, but discontinued the medication prescribed for treatment of those conditions several months ago.

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**Evaluation Procedure**

Below is a narrative summary of the evaluation procedure, a five-axis diagnostic summary of Phillip's problems, a detailed substance use diagnosis and treatment history, an assessment of placement and service needs, the staff's recommendations for specific services within each area, and an overall level of care or program placement to best address them.

**Substance Use Diagnoses and Treatment History (ASAM criteria A)**

Phillip reported first using any alcohol or other drugs at age 13 and liking to use Marijuana the most. He thinks that treatment is most needed for Marijuana use. Presented below in order of clinical severity, is each of the substances for which Phillip self-reported symptoms sufficient to
